Through generous donors, steady board leadership and strategic partnership, the Richland County Foundation embarked on a mission to expand its role as a responsive grant maker to one of becoming a transformational community leader. We launched the Economic Development Investment Strategy Project in 2014 which brought important stakeholders together to create an actionable roadmap for economic development in Richland County.

We followed that initiative with the Mansfield Rising Plan in 2018 by sending a group of emerging leaders, and soon-to-be citizen planners, to Austin, Texas to learn from some of the most creative thinkers in the world, to create the Mansfield Rising Plan that would be a catalyst for all of Richland County to grow through the revitalization of downtown Mansfield. The group's mantra would become -Mansfield is a place for business, living, and gathering.

Throughout our 78-year history, one thing will remain steadfast – Richland County is a place for philanthropy.

Community foundations are unique in that they harness the passion and generosity of people living in their communities. Through the work of a dedicated staff and board, we have been able to make impactful and lasting community investments.

The Annual Report reflects over \$6.4 million dollars in community investments made by our donors, while leveraging additional support through public and private partnerships. Investments like the grant made to The Ohio State University-Mansfield's STEM initiative will provide access on the regional campus to four-year engineering degrees. Local students now have a pathway to expanding career opportunities in computer chip production and cyber security.

The community conversation series, Kaleidoscope, will create a space for all residents to come together to learn and share ideas on building a healthier, better educated and more economically stable Richland County.

Record number of donors makes Richland Gives a success

Richland Gives, an online giving event hosted by the Richland County Foundation, raised \$514,386 via 2,000 donors to benefit 106 Richland County nonprofit organizations. Since its inception in 2015, Richland Gives has raised almost \$3M.

Richland Gives is designed to encourage people to contribute to local nonprofits they care about through a single giving website. The foundation hosted the day to build capacity, grow philanthropy and make the



community stronger. It allows local organizations to raise funds and awareness as well as cultivate new donors and reinvigorate lapsed donors.

The Foundation awarded grants as prize incentives during the giving event. The nonprofit organizations that had the most donors or raised the most dollars in the small, medium, and large nonprofit categories were awarded \$5,000 for first place, \$3,000 for second place, and \$1,000 for third place. Nonprofits could win only one leader board prize.

Mansfield Rising projects underway this year

Main Street Improvement Plan

The City of Mansfield was awarded a grant to help fund the updated Main Street streetscape. Investing in Main Street is a high priority action item in the Mansfield Rising Plan. The project will beautify Main Street, make it pedestrian friendly, add new sidewalks, crosswalks, lighting, waterlines, and drainage system. New brick crosswalks are designed to meet ADA requirements to improve visibility and safety.

A suspended catenary lighting system will be installed over Main Street between 4th and 5th streets and a decorative ring light will be suspended over the mid-block crossings on Park Avenue between Main and Diamond streets. Construction on Main Street will begin in 2025.





THE WARREN RUPP OBSERVATORY

In the 1970s Warren Rupp sat at his dining room table listening to Bruce Scodova talk about building an observatory. Bruce was so excited to present Warren with this idea that he did not notice a teenager lounging on the couch in the next room. That teenager was Steve Frampton, grandson of Warren, and current advisor to the Fran and Warren Rupp Fund at The Richland **County Foundation.**

This past summer Steve and his son, Michael, visited the Warren Rupp **Observatory at Hidden Hollow Camp** and swapped stories with Bruce about the beginnings of the observatory. The Fran and Warren Rupp Fund continues to support projects and programs in Richland County that are important to the Rupp and Frampton families.

The Warren Rupp Observatory has grown into one of the largest outreach astronomical organizations in the country.

Besides the Richland Astronomical Society, the Fran and Warren Rupp Fund supports many other organizations such as the Mansfield Art Center, Mansfield City Schools, North End Community Improvement Collaborative, Renaissance Performing Arts and Wayfinders Ohio (formerly known as Harmony House). It also has funded internships at local nonprofits since 2015.

A pilot, pharmacist, and public relations coordinator are three of the careers former Buckeye Imagination Museum interns have pursued.

The Fran and Warren Rupp Fund at the Richland County Foundation began supporting internships at local nonprofits in 2015. Each year the Rupp Fund invests \$170,000

between summer and winter internships to further the education of students and increase capacity at local charities.

Over the years, many interns walked through the doors at Little Buckeye Children's Museum, now Buckeye Imagination Museum. Each one was unique, but all have proven



DAMON MAUK MEMORIAL FUND

The Damon Mauk Memorial Fund was established by his mother Andrea and stepfather Edward with the primary goal of providing resources to schools in Richland County, starting this year with the Lucas Local Schools Special Education Department. This fund aims to bolster programs and initiatives that assist students and teachers in the classroom of neurodivergent minds, addressing their unique educational needs.

Damon Mauk faced challenges throughout his school journey, leading to an early adoption of an Individualized Education Plan (IEP). His barriers included obstacles like sensitivity to fluorescent lights and challenges in test-taking. To support his academic needs, Damon required specific accommodations such as noise-canceling headphones, a standing desk, and additional tutoring in quiet places. Damon's mother, Andrea Mauk, feels that many people lack an understanding of neurodivergent minds but that accommodations from an IEP can lead to both academic and personal success.

Andrea's vision for the Damon Mauk Memorial Fund is to create an initiative that ensures all children have the resources to learn and grow by supporting them in how the best learn. She also wants to raise awareness about IEPs and the challenges that teachers, parents, and students f when adapting to learn how children think differently in the classroom.

Despite Damon's own academic struggles, he showed compassion by actively assisting fellow classmates by no being ashamed of his differences, which helped foster inclusivity within the school community. Damon graduate on the Honor Roll from Pioneer Career and Technology Center (PCTC) and Lucas High School. He was employed Adena Construction through the Home Remodeling prog

to be successful in their lives after their internships. Here are some examples of success at the Buckeye Imagination Museum.

Natalie Tasseff was one of the first interns, she worked at Little Buckeye Children's Museum while she was a student at Ohio Northern University, studying Pharmacy. She went on to get her degree and become a licensed pharmacist.

Another well-known intern was Suzanna Hammond. She studied Child & Youth Studies at Ohio State University Mansfield. After she received her bachelor's degree, she worked full-time for the organization for over seven years. Suzanna is now pursuing her master's degree.

Katie Volz studied Aeronautics at Kent State and went on to complete her courses and became a pilot.

Finally, the most recent intern success story was Brenna Koch. She was a long-term intern for Buckeye Imagination Museum. She majored in Marketing & Business Administration at North Central State College. After graduation, she was hired full-time as the Buckeye Imagination Museum Public Relations Coordinator. She is happy to work for the museum and is very grateful for the opportunity provided by the Foundation.

DEVOTED TO CARING FOR ANIMALS

The mission of the **Humane Society** of Richland County is to advocate and compassionately care for the abandoned, abused, and neglected animals in the community and to find them loving homes.

To help further its mission, the Humane Society established an agency designated fund at the Richland County Foundation.

The fund will help sustain the Humane Society through investments made by the Foundation and additional donations from generous individuals and organizations. The fund will produce an annual income for the Humane Society.

Stability is the main reason nonprofit organizations set up a fund at the Foundation. It allows an organization to diversify its income and reduces dependency on annual fundraising. It also provides donors with an option to make gifts now or in their will.

In 2019 the Foundation awarded a grant to the Humane Society to assist with a reorganization plan for sustainability. The plan included a newly created position, managing director, to provide leadership in operations, including budgeting and fundraising.

"The new fund is exciting for us, and things have come full circle. Thank you for taking a chance on us when the shelter was on the verge of closing. It



was an investment in us, and I am proud we turned things around," said Humane Society of Richland County Managing Director Linda Chambers.

"Investing through the Foundation is the most meaningful type of investment for us. You believed in us, and we believe in you," said Chambers.

"The Humane Society is a success story and you have paved a path for others to follow," said Richland County Foundation President Brady Groves.

The Humane Society rescues and protects mostly cats and dogs; however, it also cares for an occasional goat or horse. The Humane Society serves three to four times the number of cats versus dogs. A typical census is 15 dogs and 30-50 cats.

The Humane Society hosts three fundraisers a year. In the spring, a gift appeal letter is sent to raise funds

for the annual influx of kittens. In the summer, iHeart Media Vice President of Programming and Humane Society Board Member Chris Kelly conducts a "Paws-a-thon" on the radio. In the fall, "Dogs, Drinks and Donuts" is held at the Phoenix Brewing Company which was a huge success last year.

The organization posts social media campaigns to meet a specific need such as a costly surgery.

"It is amazing how quickly people help. They can see the immediate impact of their gift through a healthy animal," said Chambers.

Two projects planned for this year are the installation of a generator and a Catio, the Humane Society's version of a three-season room. The space will allow cats to roam free and get fresh air.

The sandstone blocks that now mark the entrance to Deer Park were salvaged from the demolition of the former Ocie





and community involvement. For many years, the mission was successfully accomplished through a grant cycle supported by a membership program, which included social events and networking opportunities. Between 2006 to 2020 the Connections Fund awarded 101 grants totaling \$120,000.

Enter the pandemic. As social events were off-limits and the main driver for fundraising to support the grant budget, the committee was faced with taking a hiatus from grantmaking and social gatherings. Although disappointing, it afforded the committee a chance to consider ways to strengthen its program of work.

The fund now focuses on connecting with emerging philanthropists, rather than just young professionals, to meet individuals where they are in their philanthropic journey no matter their age.

Recognizing the inherent need nonprofit organizations have for volunteers, the committee has a goal to volunteer at least once a quarter. In 2023 members participated in eight volunteer opportunities.

Instead of an open grant application, the committee will make an intentional and focused grant annually.
